

What extra-curricular activities are available?

As a school, we actively encourage our students to pursue their talents outside of school hours. We currently have many talented musicians, artists and sports players attending our school. We also accommodate a number of extra-curricular activities in the school and plan on growing the choices available going forward.

Is this school suitable for children with special needs?

Yes. Our school caters for pupils with special needs and has the same supports available as other schools. All evidence shows that pupils with special needs do just as well in an Irish-medium setting as they do in the English-medium system. Total early immersion is recognised as the most successful model for children with special needs (Baker, 2000).

Who are An Foras Pátrúnachta?

An Foras Pátrúnachta is the patron of our school and is the largest patron of Irish-medium schools in Ireland. There are 15,000 students attending the 70 schools under their patronage. 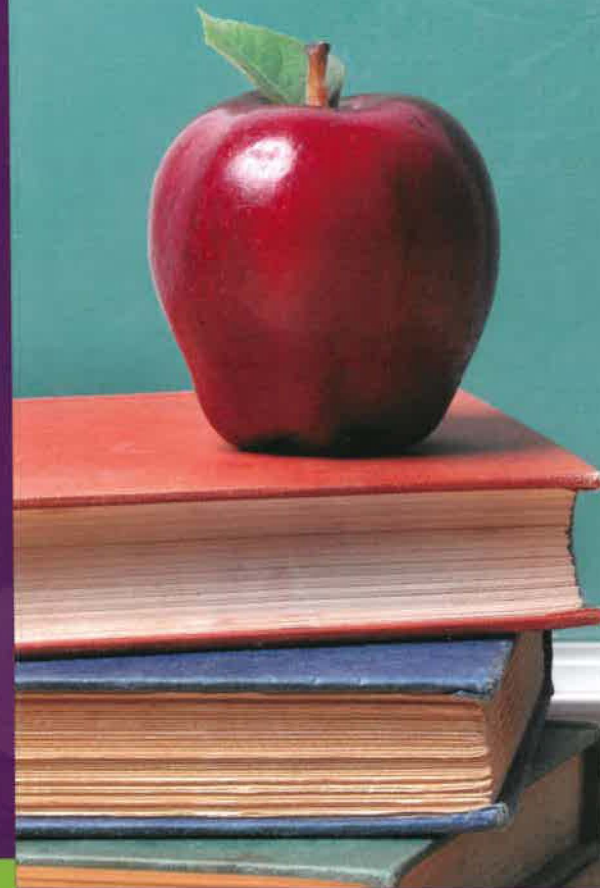

WHY SHOULD I CHOOSE THIS SCHOOL?

Academic: Children in Gaescoileanna achieve higher results in English & Maths in the National Standardisation tests. In addition to being fluent in Irish, children will more easily acquire their 3rd/4th languages.

Our School

Our school is a Gaelscoil which is a co-educational, Irish-medium, primary school. We have been providing diversity and choice to parents from day one with a team of dedicated teaching and non-teaching staff. What is a gaelscoil?

A gaelscoil is a school where all communication and learning is through Irish. Students will leave the school being able to read, write and speak fluently in both English and Irish. The schools are fully State-funded. They follow the standard Department of Education & Skills curriculum and are subject to the same inspections as other State schools. Children leave at the end of 6th Class having benefitted from a full and varied curriculum with the added benefit of being bi-lingual.

Why choose this school?

Our pupils thrive in a positive, happy learning environment. They enjoy all the benefits of a diverse education and have many opportunities to explore digital learning from a very early age. Assessment scores in Irish, English and Maths are very impressive. Our immersion education model brings many extra benefits which you will not find in other school types. The immersion process is so successful that the youngest of our pupils, coming from English speaking families are speaking Irish effortlessly within their first year of enrolling.

96% of parents in our school have little or no Irish. The teachers understand this and homework is given with this in mind.
